

The following terms and conditions apply for the think.BDPST Young Leaders' Forum 2021 and the think.BDPST 2021 conference:

1. Guests understand and accept that tickets (also referred to as vouchers) cannot be transferred or exchanged. Guests agree that tickets are for personal use and may not be resold or transferred. The resale of tickets is prohibited. The Antall József Knowledge Centre (hereinafter: "**AJKC**") reserves the right to cancel any tickets that have been resold.
2. Following the official programme of the Young Leaders' Forum 2021 (12-13 October 2021), participants will attend the think.BDPST 2021 conference. Arrival will be possible from 9am.
3. AJKC reserves the right, without compensation, to refuse admission to any person whose conduct is disorderly or unbecoming (including, but not limited to abusive, threatening, or other behaviour, or making unauthorised audio, video, or photographic recordings). Also, due to the current COVID-19 pandemic, AJKC, as event organiser, is responsible to ensure a safe environment with appropriate measures taken. As a part of this, AJKC is entitled to require the showing of immunity certificates of attendees of the live event (YLF and think.BDPST), including immunity cards, either in a printed or online format through QR code that is available in the official application, or the EU Digital COVID Certificate, and inspect the appropriate use of facemasks, social distancing etc. Please kindly note that these may be subject to change due to the rapidly changing circumstances brought about by the pandemic, therefore, we suggest that you visit our webpages, think.bdpst.org and ylf.think.bdpst.org, prior to the event to learn about any changes that might occur regarding on-site health and safety measures. We kindly ask you to consider the above requirements before submitting your application, as we will be unable to host you in the absence of the above document.
4. Guests understand and accept that "think.BDPST" is a trademark of AJKC.
5. Guests understand and accept that no audio or video recording is allowed during the conference unless having the prior written consent of AJKC. Although the event is open for the press, performers and speakers have the right to ask photographers not to take pictures of them. Therefore, guests are kindly asked to refrain from taking pictures. This also holds true for the virtual domain.
6. The conference will be recorded in its entirety. By attending the conference, guests acknowledge that their image might be used by AJKC in promotional photographs or their likeness appear in any live or recorded video display based on AJKC's legitimate interest.
7. AJKC reserves the right to change the programme.
8. AJKC may postpone, cancel, interrupt, or stop the event in case of adverse weather, dangerous situations, or any other circumstances beyond its reasonable control.

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9. Guests understand and accept that AJKC has the right to conduct discreet safety and security checks at the conference venues, and may, from time to time, carry out security searches in line with the applying legal provisions. Prohibited items, including, but not limited to, weapons or dangerous substances are not allowed to be brought to the event, they have to be handed over to the organisers of the conference.
10. Information collected from the registration process shall remain confidential, and shall be used in accordance with the privacy policy of AJKC, which is part of these conditions.
11. Any complaints regarding the event will be directed to and dealt with by the project manager and the statutory representative of AJKC.

Privacy Policy

The privacy policy of AJKC applies to personal information collected during the registration/application process. You will be asked to provide the following data during your application:

Information provided by the attendees during registration/application shall remain confidential, and shall not be sold, traded, or transferred to third parties for commercial purposes. All the personal information collected will be used for creating your badge, conducting the event, processing transactions, or sending newsletters. The e-mail address provided by attendees during the registration/application may be used to send updates and notifications regarding the conference if the consumer gives explicit consent for the aforementioned data processing. The legal basis of the data processing is the informed explicit consent given by the consumer during the registration (as per Article 6.1. a) of GDPR). Data necessary for the performance of later transactions are processed based on the performance of a contract by AJKC (as per Article 6.1. b) of GDPR). As for the existence of an attendee's Immunity Card (as per Governmental Decree 60/2021 (II.12.)) or immunity certificate, please note that information about a person's immunity status constitutes sensitive data as defined in point 15. of Article 4 of GDPR. During the checking of the Card, no data is recorded. The purpose of this processing is to fulfil the obligation as event

organiser of ensuring a safe environment during the event. AJKC, as the organiser, and the operator of the venue processes the data of immunity status based on the legal obligation (as per Article 6.1. c) of GDPR) stemming from Governmental Decree 194/2021. (IV.26) AJKC processes the personal data only until it is necessary for the purpose stated above.

AJKC keeps the personal data in line with the applicable law ensuring that only employees, or other persons acting on behalf of AJKC (e.g. the Data Processors listed below) have access to the data who need the access in order to perform their job or tasks. The employees with access have signed appropriate Confidentiality Agreements pertaining to the data they come in contact with while fulfilling their duties.

Please note that for the purposes of the development and maintenance of the webpages of the event (think.bdpst.org, ylf.think.bdpst.org, startupexpo.think.bdpst.org), the web developer of the think.BDPST webpages, WP Online – Creative Digital (Seat: 7-8 Ferenciek tere, 1053, Budapest, Hungary), may access personal data as data processor provided during the registration process. WP Online – Creative Digital shall keep all collected data confidential pursuant to the contract concluded with AJKC. Please also note that, for the purposes of processing and managing your registration, the agency responsible for event management, Ad Valorem (Seat: 48-50 Szent László Way, 1135 Budapest), may also access as data processor personal data provided during registration. Ad Valorem is obliged to keep confidential all data as per the data processing contract signed with AJKC. Please also be informed that rentIT (9 Komócsy Street, 1141 Budapest), which company is responsible for the online organisation of the conference, as well as tasks related to such online realisation, may also access as data processor personal data provided during registration. rentIT is also bound to keep confidential all data that it might receive as per the contract signed with AJKC.

As data subject, based on Articles 14-21 of the GDPR, among others you have a right of access to or correction of your personal data processed by AJKC, or you may ask AJKC to erase, restrict, or port your personal information and object to the use of your personal information. When data processing is based on your consent, you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time by sending a request to the following email address: info@think.bdpst.org. For processing necessary to perform the contract, or based on legitimate interest, AJKC may not be able to accommodate the request to stop the processing, or if we do so, it may mean that you can no longer access the services or the digital content.

If you believe that AJKC has processed your personal information in violation of applicable law, you may file a complaint at the address: info@think.bdpst.org. You may contact a supervisory authority, namely the Hungarian National Authority for Data Protection and Freedom of Information (1363 Budapest, Pf.: 9., or 1055 Budapest, Falk Miksa utca 9-11. tel: +36 1 391 1400, fax: +36 1 391 1410, e-mail: ugyfelszolgalat@naih.hu, www.naih.hu) or directly the court. General courts have jurisdiction for the suit. The suit—if requested by the data subject—may be initiated at the general court of the home address or habitual residence of the data subject. Upon the request of the Data subject, the Data controller informs the Data subject about the possibility and measures of remedy.
